What is it?

The Blacktown City Creative Arts Fund offers funding opportunities for new projects, creative growth and professional artistic development for local artists, groups and organisations.

Applicants are invited to submit creative ideas, initiatives and projects across a range of mediums including performance, visual arts, music, film, digital art, podcast, multimedia, dance, photography or professional development.

Successful applicants can receive up to \$5000 to help fund artistic and creative projects

Who can apply?

Applicants can be:

- Individuals aged 18 and above and living in the Blacktown Local Government Area
- An incorporated non-political, non-religious organisation or group that is providing services to residents in Blacktown City
- An ABN-registered non-profit, non-government community, cultural or arts organisation or group operating in Blacktown City.

***Funding is not available to employees of Blacktown City Council or their direct family members, Ward Councillors or members of the Blacktown City Council Arts and Culture Advisory Committee.



How do applications get selected?

Applications will be assessed on the following criteria:

- originality of ideas and creativity
- clearly defined project descriptions, aims and outcomes
- how the project benefits the Blacktown community
- the applicant's capacity to deliver the project.
- if working with the community, the level and quality of engagement processes with the community
- a complete and realistic budget.

How do I apply?

You will need to:

- provide information about your practice, or the organisation you are representing
- describe the project in-depth
- identify the desired outcomes
- complete a budget explaining how you would make use of the funding
- provide support material or examples that will help communicate your project.
